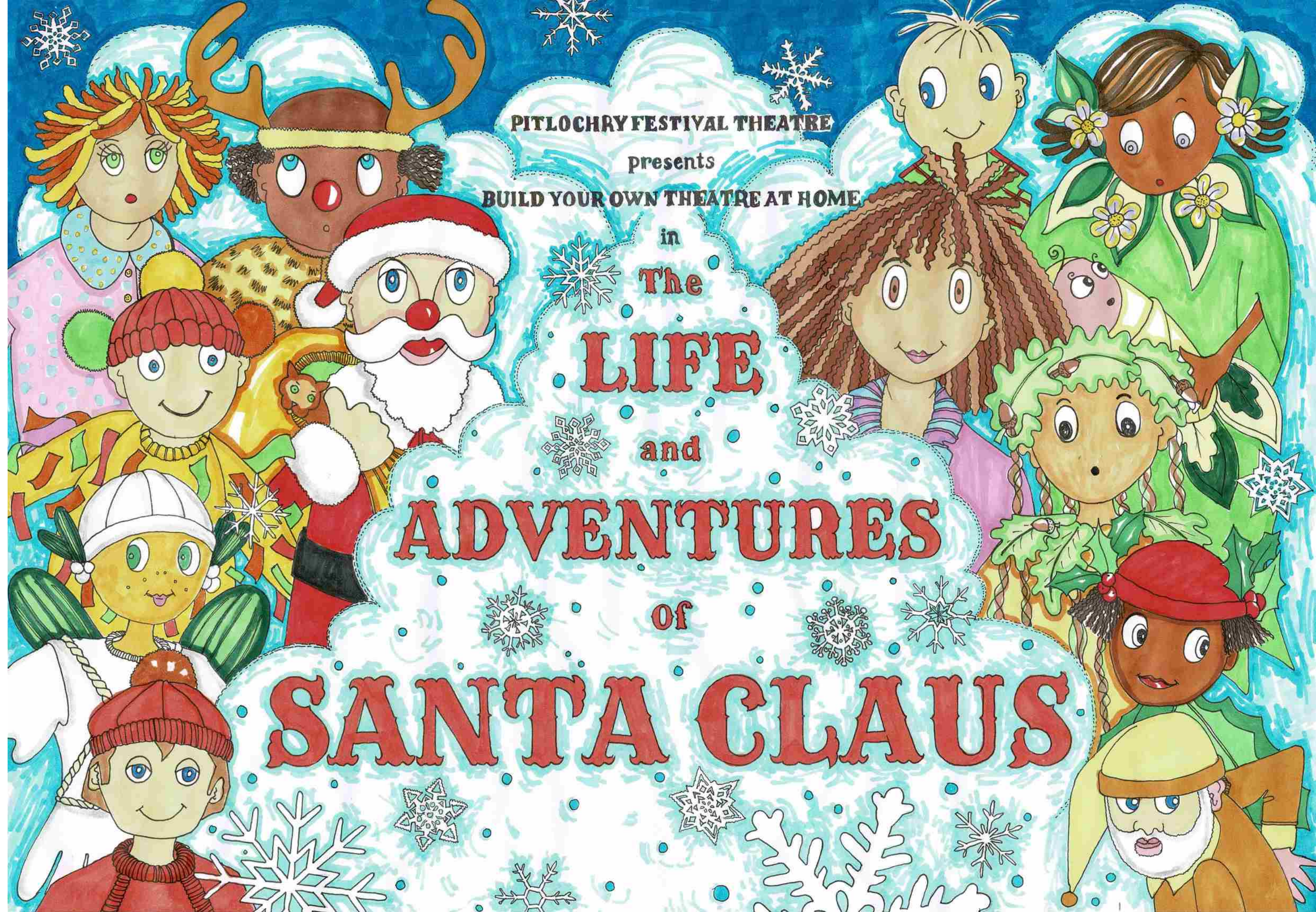

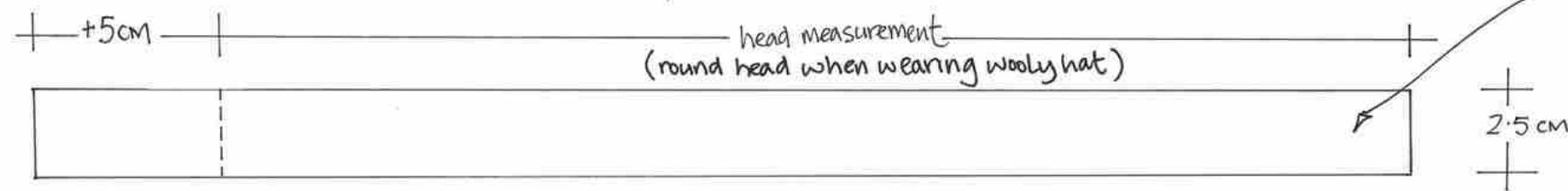

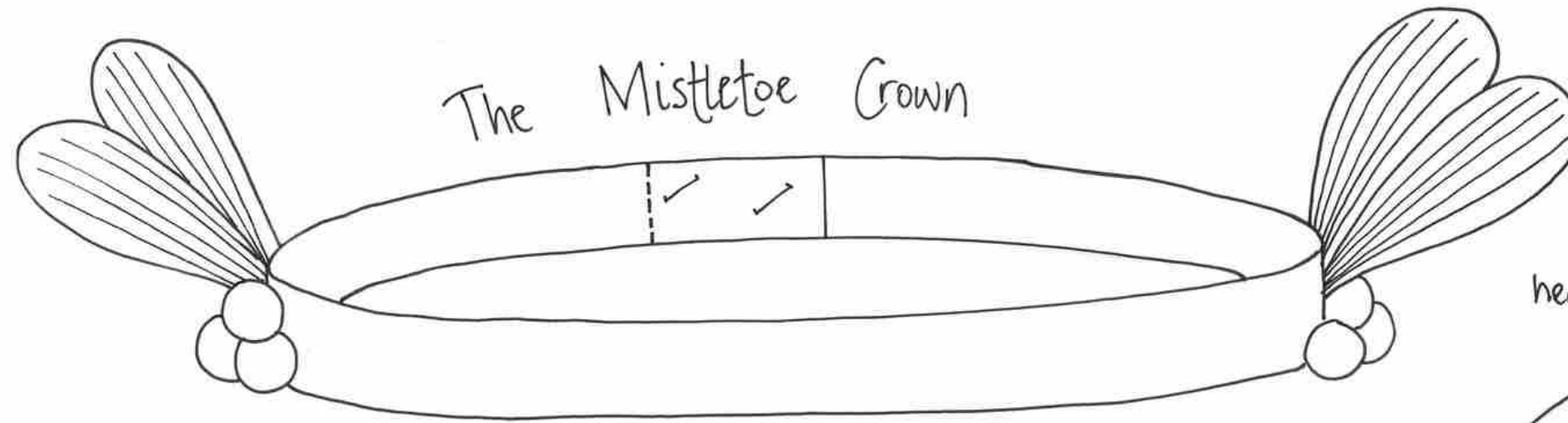


# The Fairy

## How to Make The Fairy's Mistletoe Crown

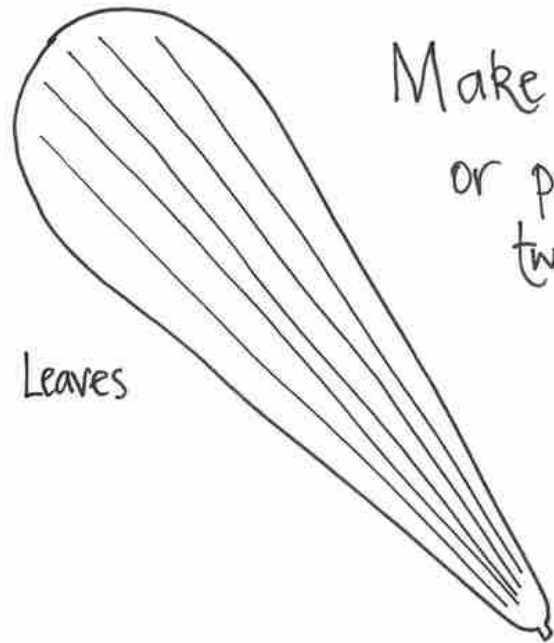


white card with

sparkles on it.



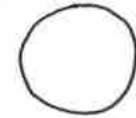
Make sure the

two on each side by your ears.



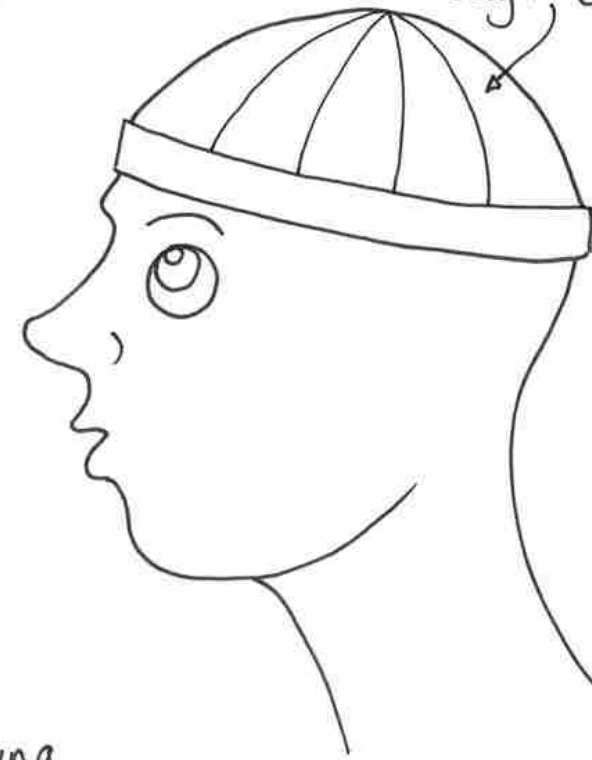

# The Fairy

how to make the Fairy's wings.

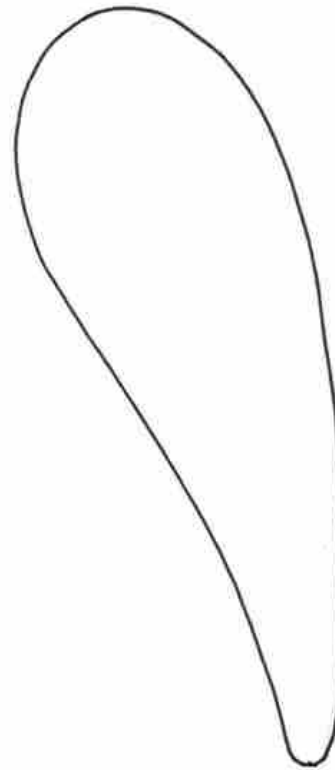
Fix 2 safety pins to the back of each wing. These will attach to the braces

Make "braces" out of ribbon, or elastic. They will support the wings

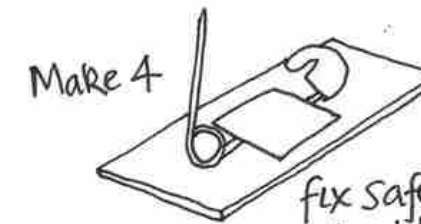
Cut the bottom of the T-shirt and sleeves into scallops shapes.



Cut two wings like these out of Card.



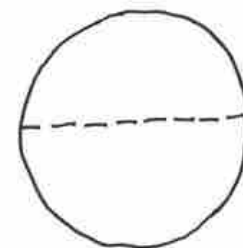
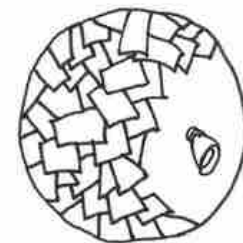
Cover the wing shapes with squares of green tissue paper — remember to cover both sides



fix safety pin to a strip of card with strong sticky tape. Glue them to the wings as shown

Glue 'berries' to base of the wings

Cut out cardboard circles for berries, or you could make papier maché 3D berries.



Cut in 2



Paint white, or cover in white paper

Cover a round balloon with papier maché

Collar

- 1 Find a piece of ribbon that will tie comfortably around your neck.  
IT MUST NOT BE TOO TIGHT.
- 2 Make the leaves bigger than the ones on Necile's headdress. They have a contrast colour on top.
- 3 Fix the leaves to the collar ribbon with the wire
- 4 Cut the flower shapes as before, but do not use wire.  
Cut a circle of yellow paper for the centre of each flower.  
Give them in place on the collar and maybe use safety pins for the dress/T-shirt.



Belt

- ① You will need a piece of ribbon that will tie comfortably round your waist.
- 2 Make the leaves in the same way as on the previous page. These leaves have a contrasting colour leaf shape stuck on top.
- 3 Use the wires to attach the leaves to the waist/belt ribbon.

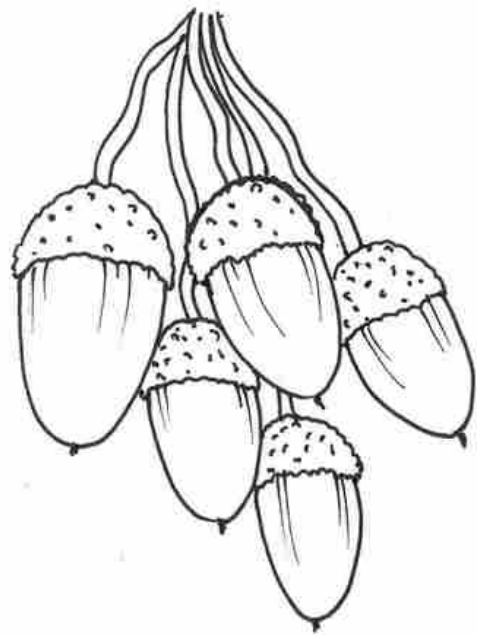

How to Make the Great Ak's Staff

Draw a big acorn  
on a piece of yellow  
card. Cut it out and  
then add lots of  
detail with crayons  
and felt tipped  
pens

Fix the acorn to  
the top of a  
broom handle



Draw lots and lots of  
acorns on yellow card  
and glue them to pieces  
of brown wool. These are  
to be tied to the pole near  
the big acorn.



Wear  
brown slippers  
or pumps

# The Great Ak

how to Make AK's Collar.

1 Make oak leaves:-

Cut them out of brown paper and stick them together with a thin wire sandwiched between

2 Attach the leaves to the collar with their wires

3 Glue acorns to the oak leaves. You can either find real acorns, or draw ones on paper, colour them and cut them out.

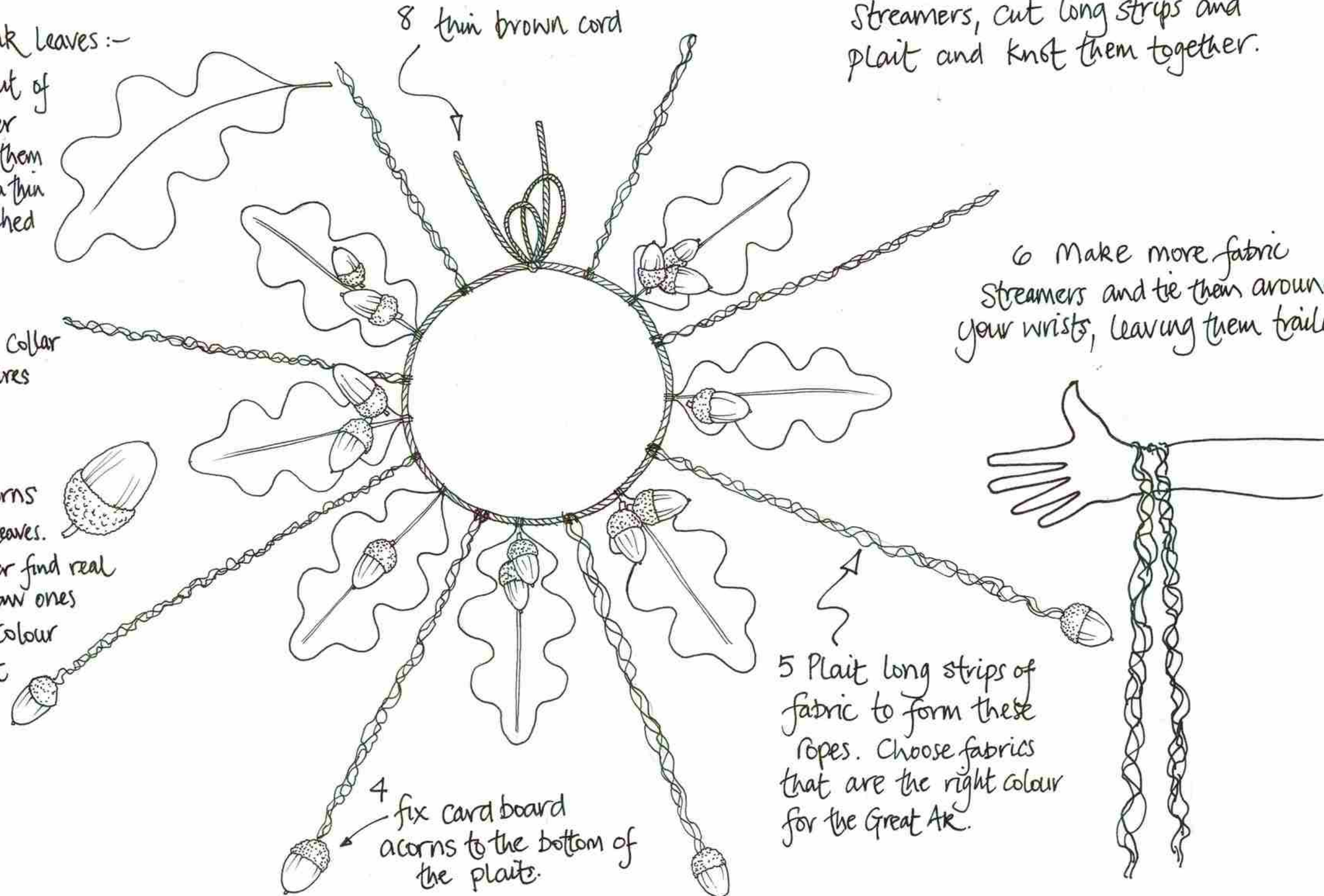
8 thin brown cord

7 to make the Great Ak's trailing streamers, cut long strips and plait and knot them together.

6 Make more fabric streamers and tie them around your wrists, leaving them trailing

5 Plait long strips of fabric to form these ropes. Choose fabrics that are the right colour for the Great Ak.

4 fix cardboard acorns to the bottom of the plaits.

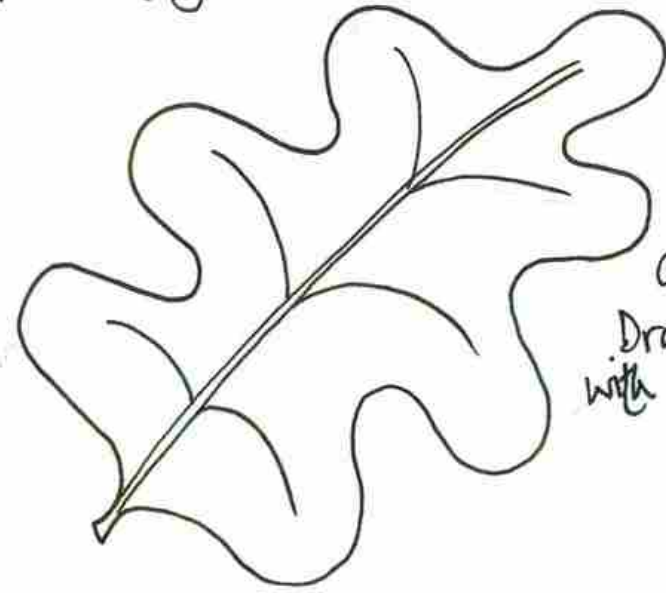
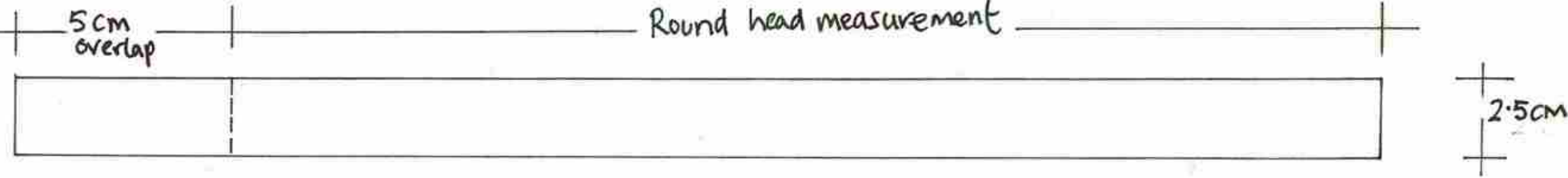

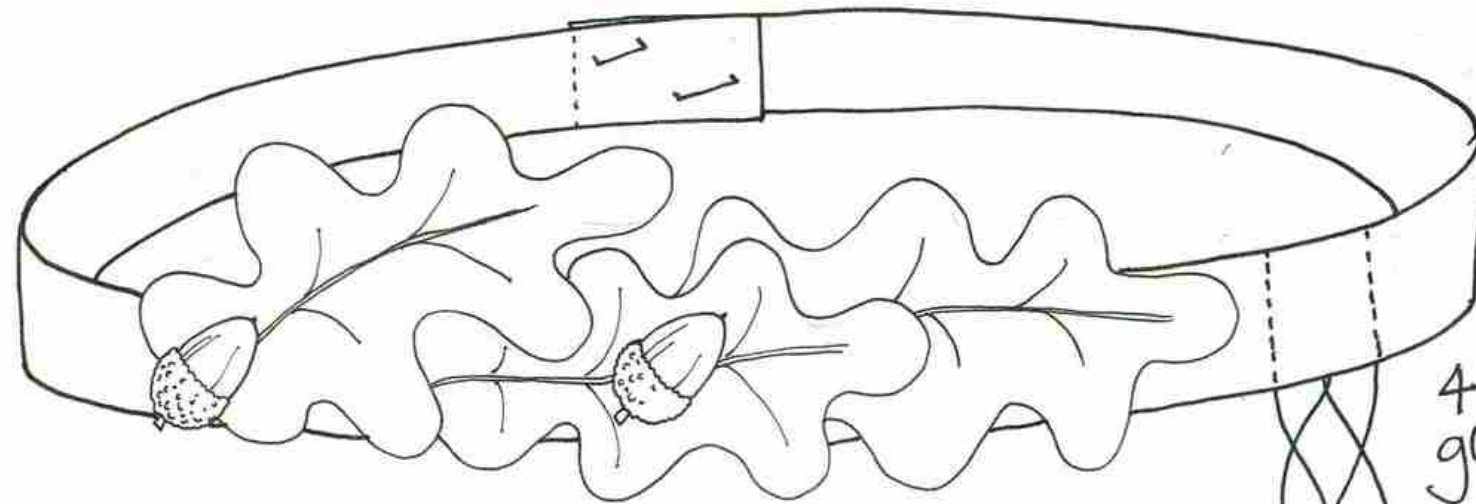

1 Make a cardboard headband and cover it with green paper, or paint it green.

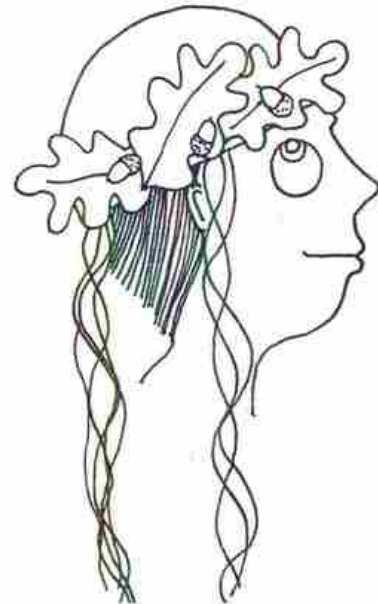


2 Draw oak leaf shapes on green paper, or card and cut them out. Draw veins on them with crayons.

5 Glue leaves to head band, overlapping them as you go. You could also use real leaves. Glue acorns to the leaves.

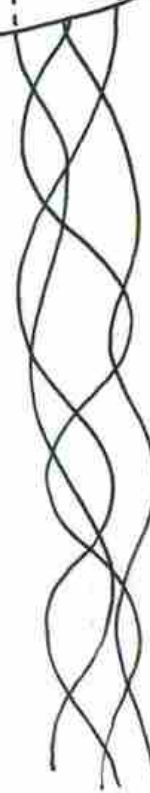


3 Draw and cut out acorn shapes from yellow paper and add details with brown crayons

4 glue the plaits to the inside of the headband

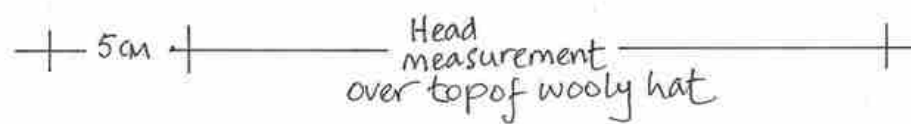




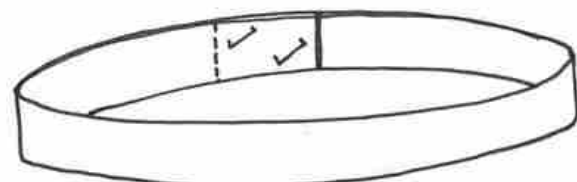
# Knook

Cut a strip of red card with 5cm extra.  
It should be long enough to go over the wooly hat



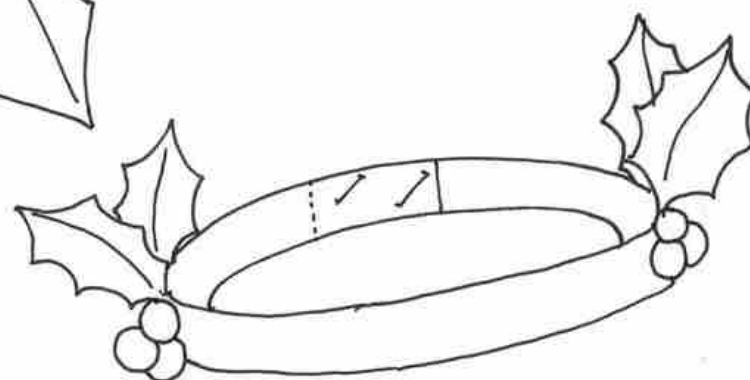
fixed the strip ends together to form the head band.



cut holly leaves out of green paper



Make berries out of rolled up paper, or use pom-poms.



fix the berries and leaves to the head band over the ears.

how to make Knook's clothes



Red wooly hat with head band over the top, as shown at left

Holly Leaf necklace

Green T'shirt with shaped sleeves

Holly Leaf waist decoration

Green shorts with shaped bottom

Red wellington boots

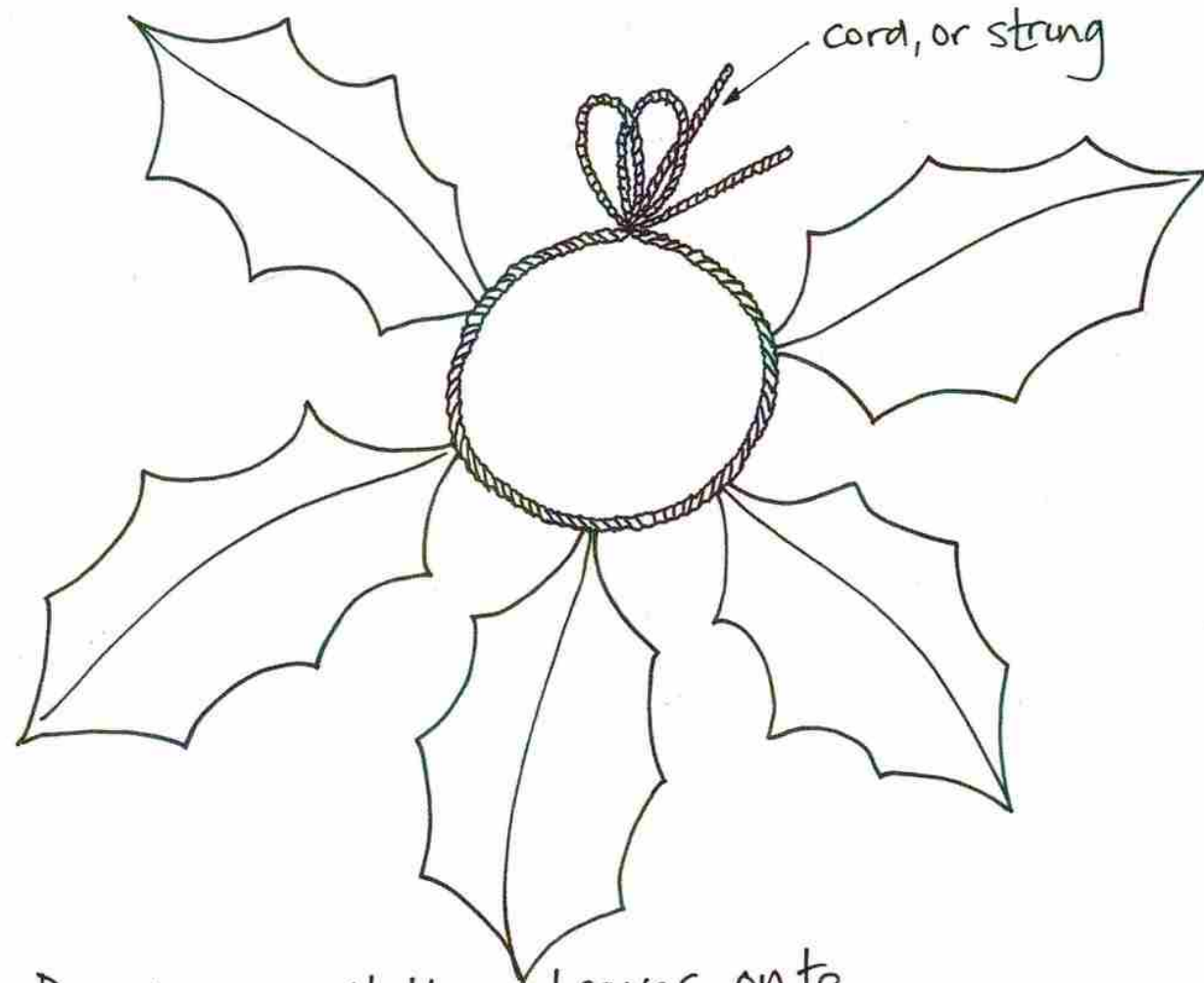

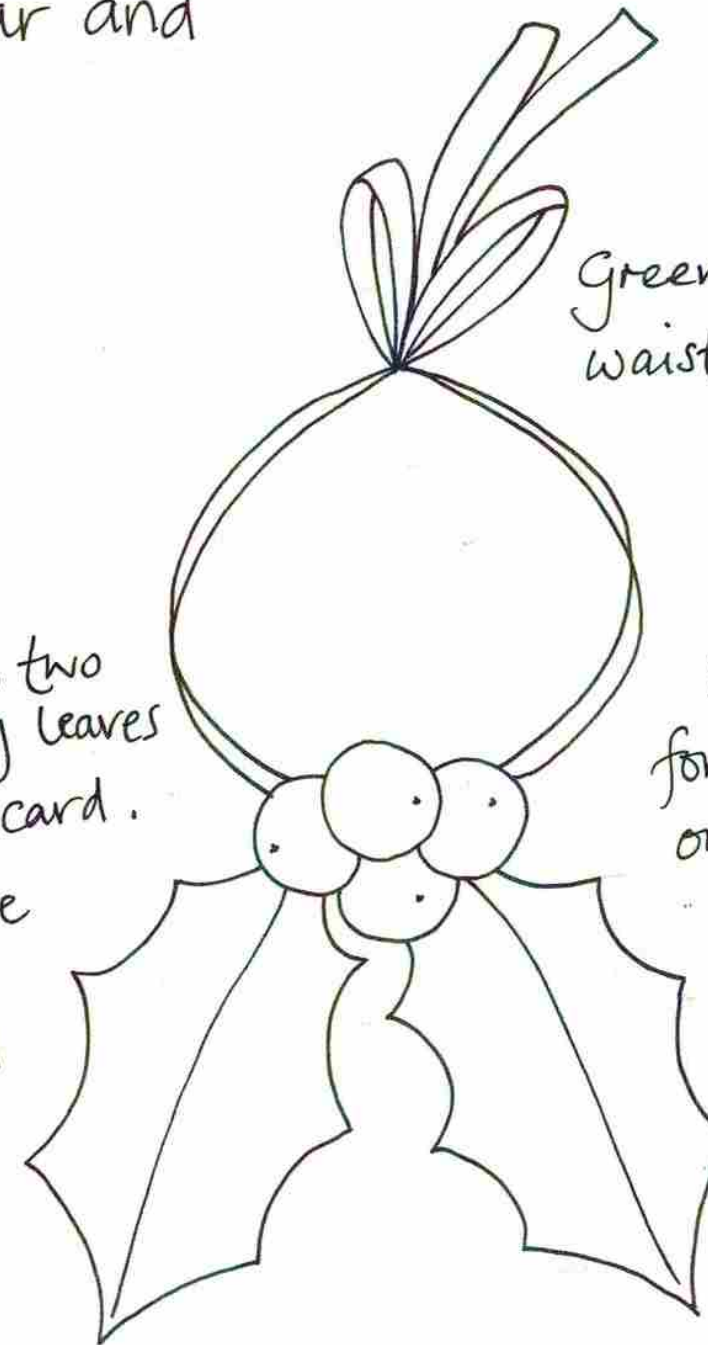

Draw some Holly leaves onto Card - either green card, or paint them green - and cut them out. Then, attach them to the collar cord with small safety pins and clear sticky tape.

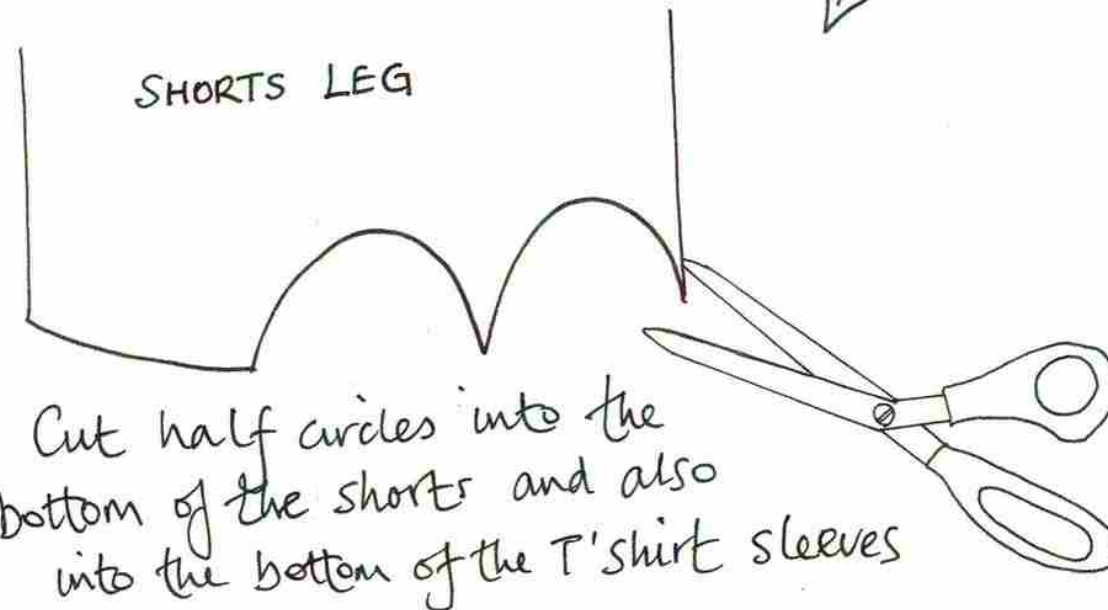
Cut out two large holly leaves from green card.  
Fix them to the ribbon waistband with safety pins and clear sticky tape



Green ribbon for waistband.

Cut large circles for the holly berries out of red card, or paint them red.

Glue them to the two large holly leaves.



Ask an adult to help you with the cutting and sticking.





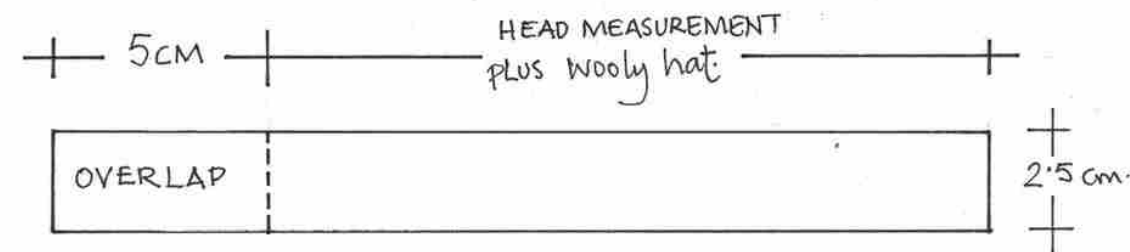

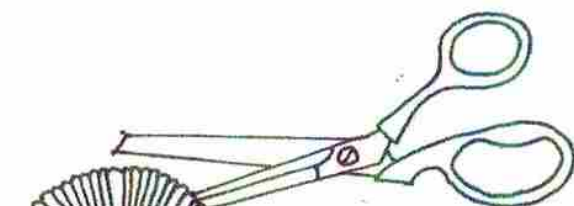
How to Make a Pom-Pom!



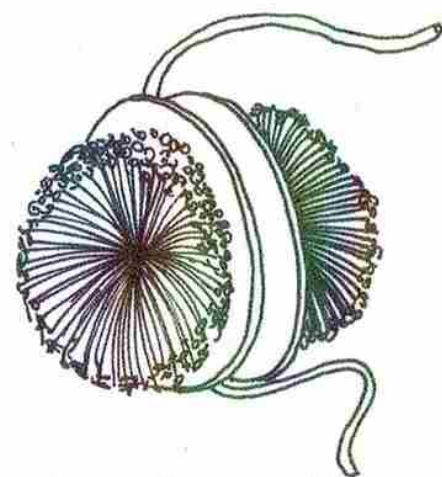
Cut two circles of card as big as the Pom Poms you want. Cut a central hole in each one.



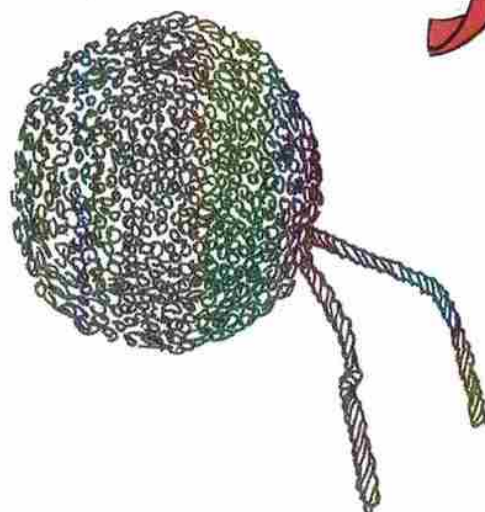
Put the two pieces of card together and carefully pass a thread of wool through it again and again, until it is completely covered.



Ask a grown up to cut the wool between the cards with scissors all the way round.



When the wool has been cut all the way round, tie a length of wool round, tie a length of wool between the card circles until all the wool is trapped securely



Ask a grown up to carefully cut away the card and then you can fluff up the wool and sew it to the hat.



① Find a brightly coloured woolly hat. Make 3 Pom-Poms and sew them on to the hat as shown!

② Find a BIG Jumper and sew, or pin on to it lots of different coloured ribbons, or strips of colourful fabric until you've completely covered it.

③ you can use the same trousers and Wellington Boots as before.

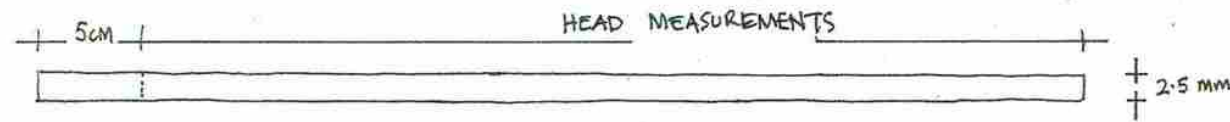


# Claus as an Old Man

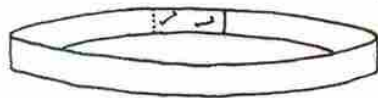

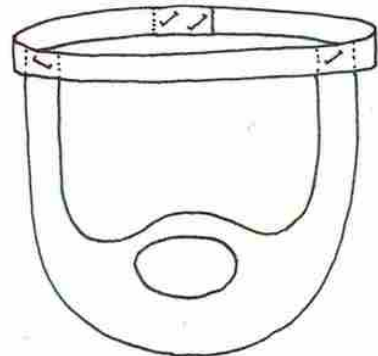


Measure your head and add 5cm. Cut a strip of cardboard 2.5 cm deep and the length of your measurement

Staple the card strip together overlapping the 5cm

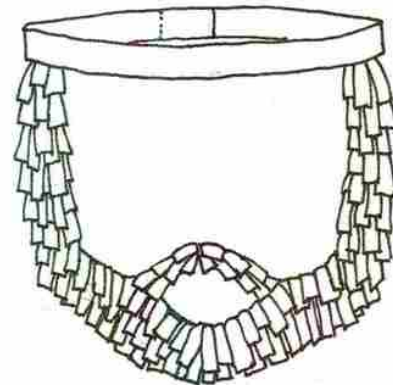


Cut out a beard shape in card and attach to the head band, as shown



Find a BIG shirt and wear it like a night shirt

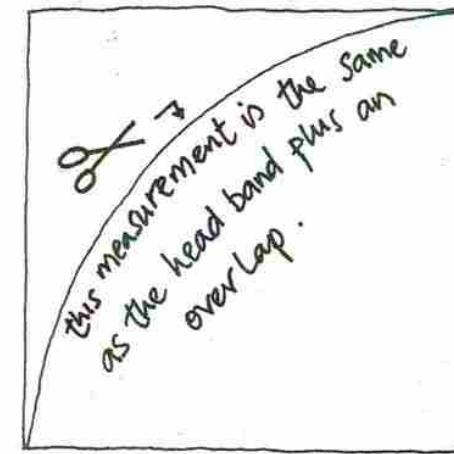
Cut strips of grey and white crepe paper and glue the top part of each strip to the beard shape, starting at the bottom and overlapping as you go



Gnarled Walking Stick

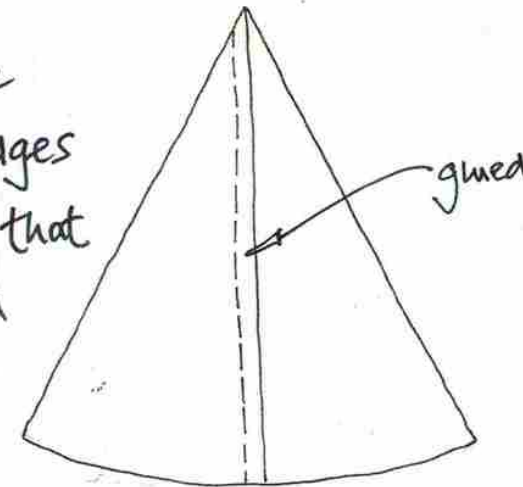


Black trousers and Wellington Boots

- ① Find a piece of cloth - red.  
Cut it into a square.  
Draw an arc with a piece of chalk  
and cut along it.



- ② Fold the two straight  
edges together, or sew them  
if you'd prefer

cardigan, or jumper.

Sew cotton wool to the  
cuffs like fur. Also put  
some round neck for a fur  
collar

Sew buttons down the front.

Make a belt out of a long  
strip of black card, or paper.

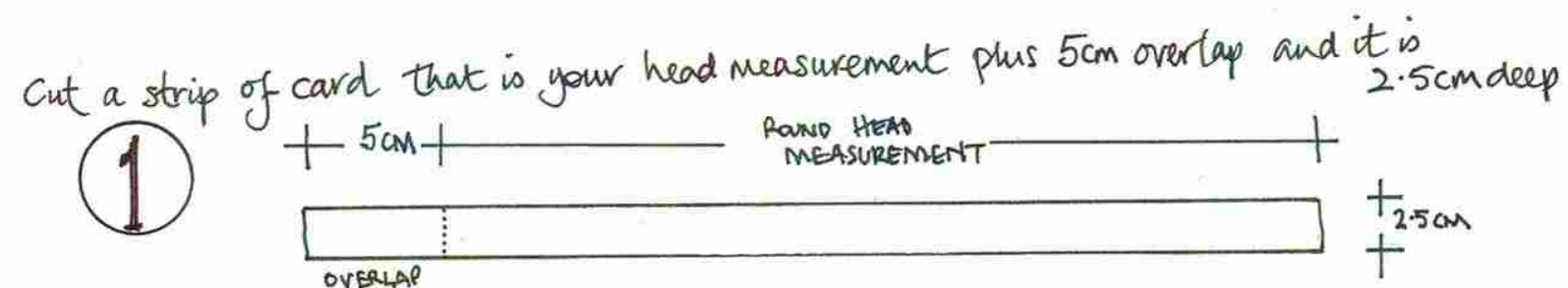

the buckle and paint it gold.  
Stick it to the front of the belt.

black wellington boots.

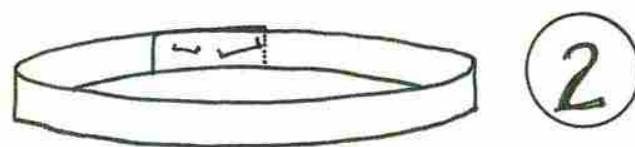




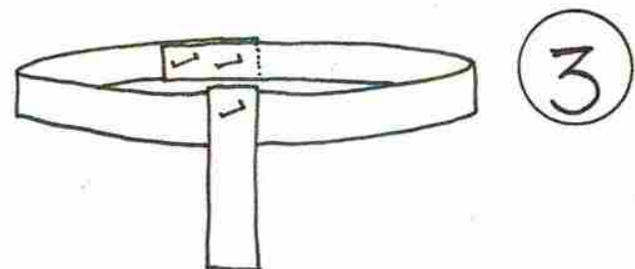

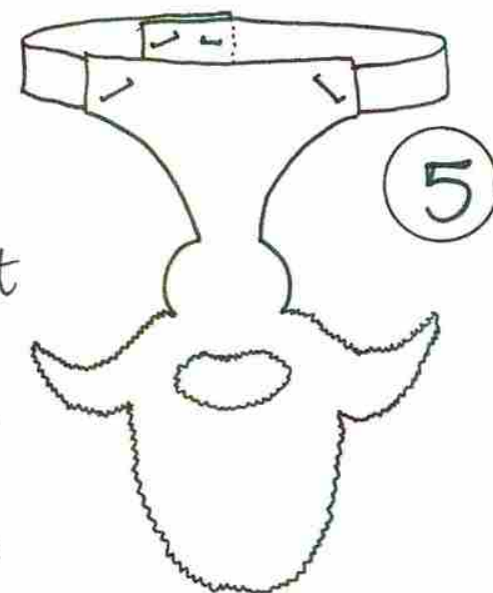
Form the card into a ring and staple together, overlapping the 5cm



Cut a support strip for the mask and fix it at the front of the head band as shown

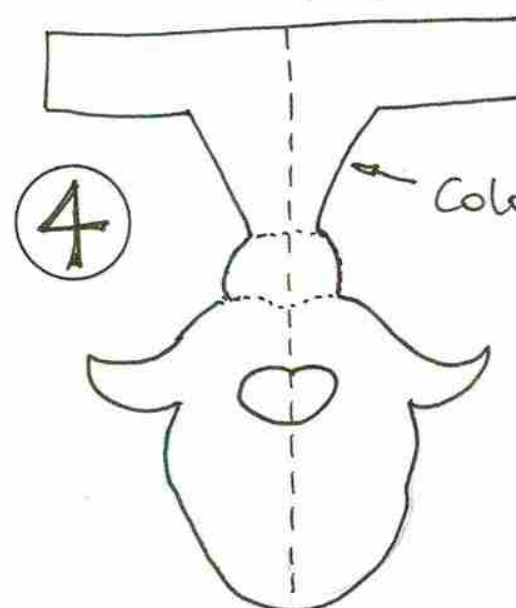


Fold a piece of card, or thick paper in half. Draw out Santa's face shape on one side as seen at

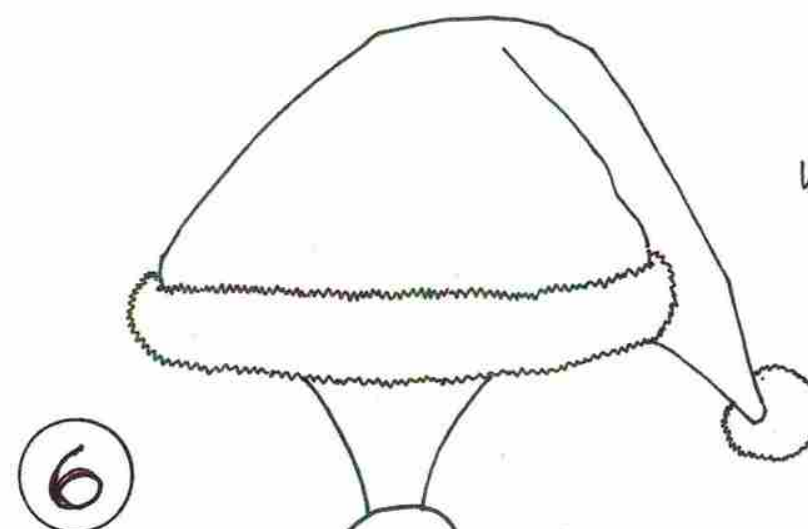

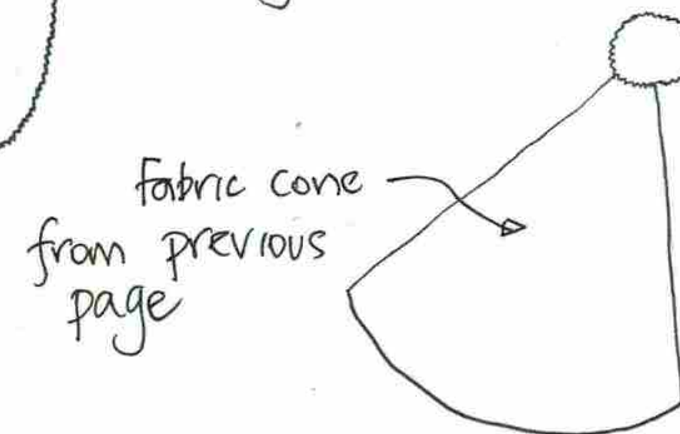


Colour this area with paint, or crayons to match the skin colour of the person playing Santa Claus. Paint the nose red.



Glue more cotton wool around the head band.

Fix the red fabric cone onto the inside of the head band.



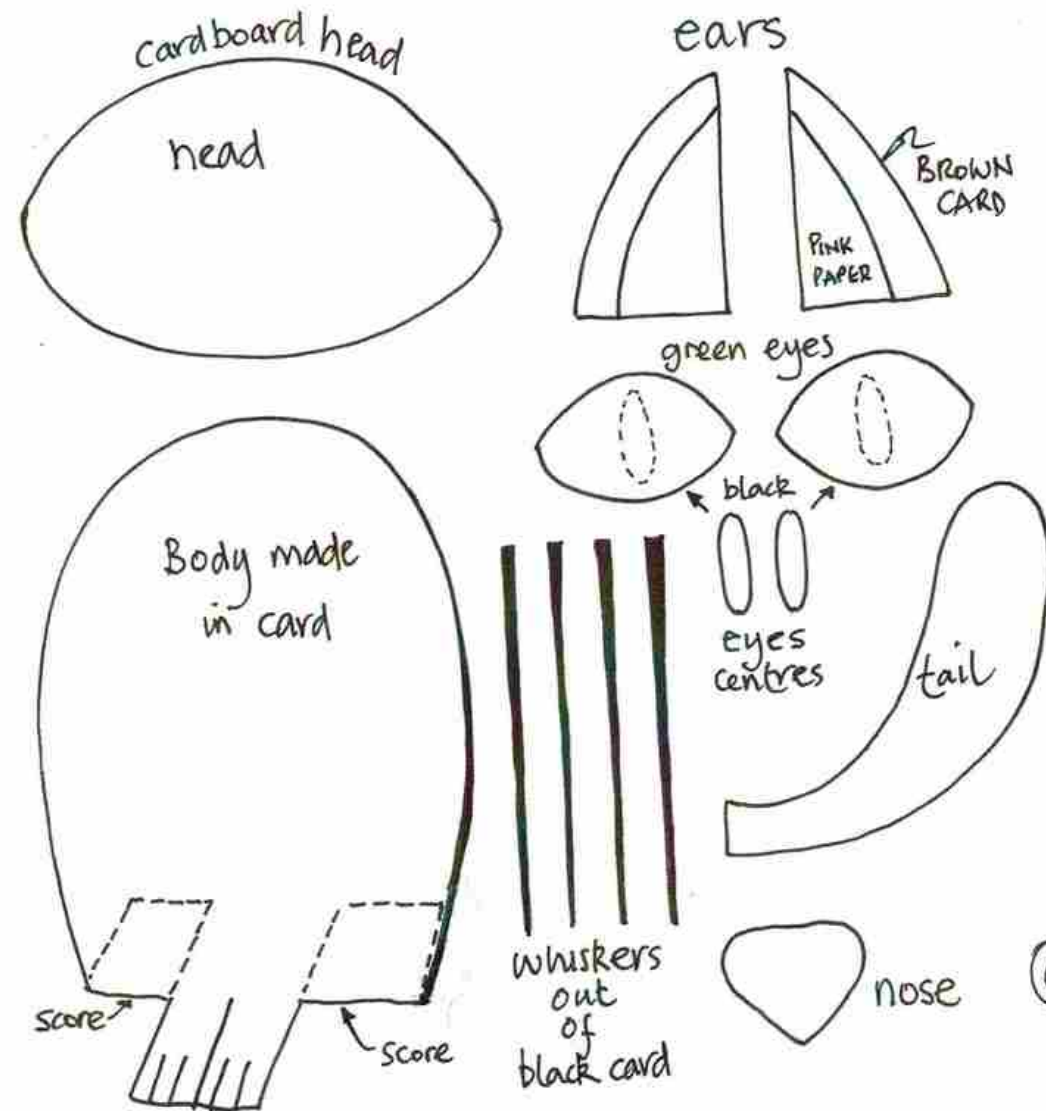

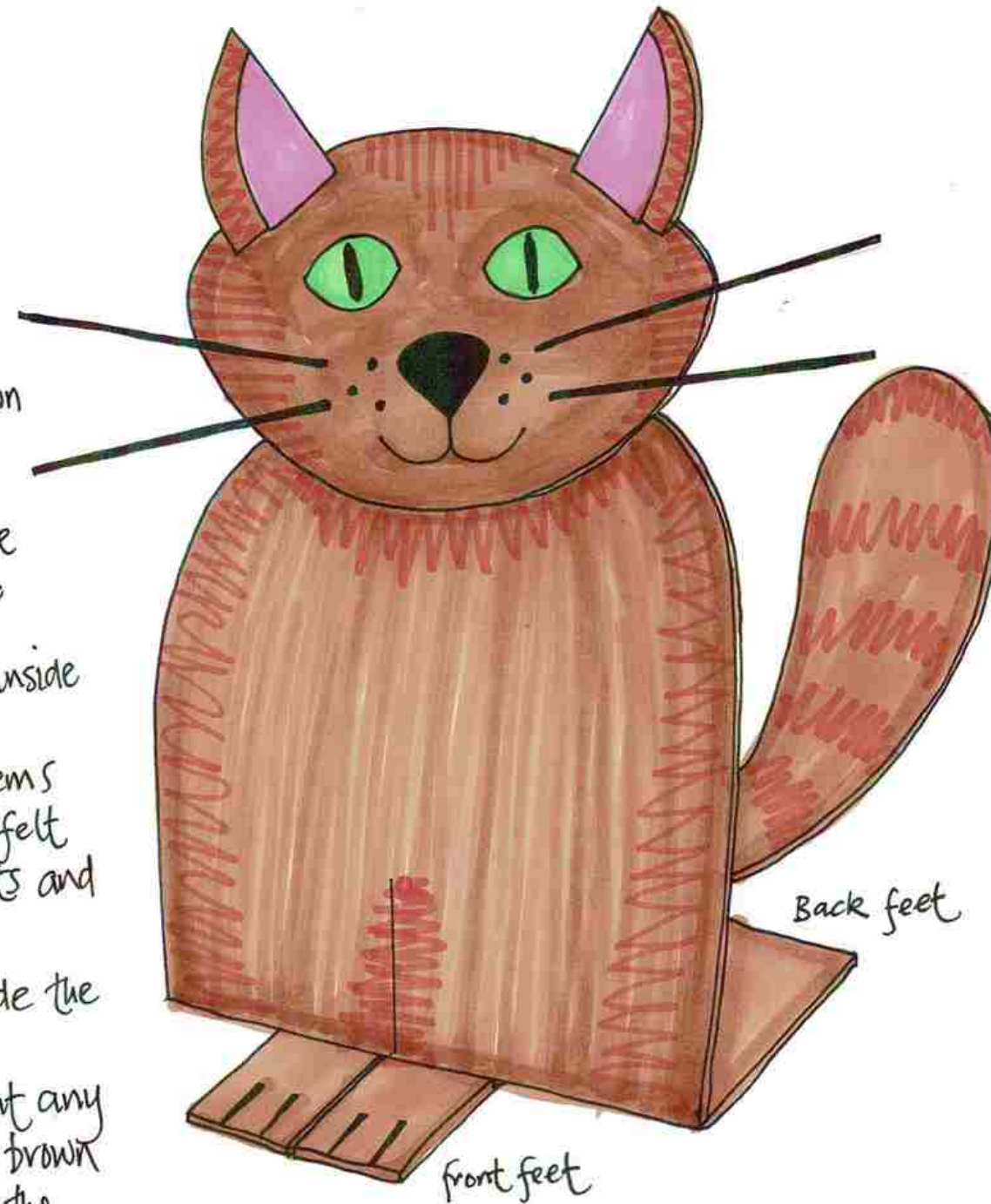


# Make some animal toys like Claus



- ① Cut out the pieces of the cat's body as shown on the left.
- ② Score the card body at the bottom and make two cuts to form the feet. Fold the two outside feet back wards and the two inside feet forwards.
- ③ Glue all the face items to the head and use a felt tipped pen to put on dots and the mouth.
- ④ Use felt pens to shade the body, head and tail.
- ⑤ You can make the cat any colour you want. This is brown.
- ⑥ Glue head and tail to the body. Your cat should now stand up!

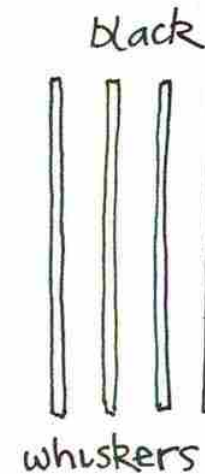
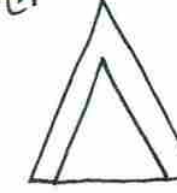
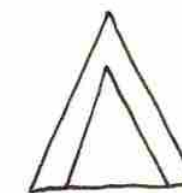
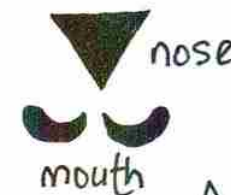
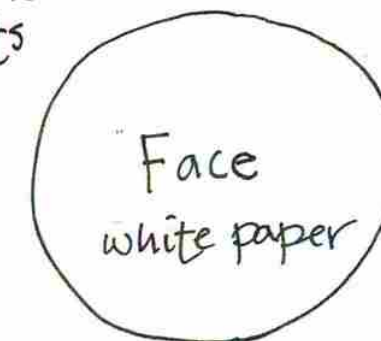
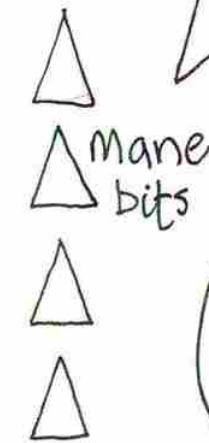
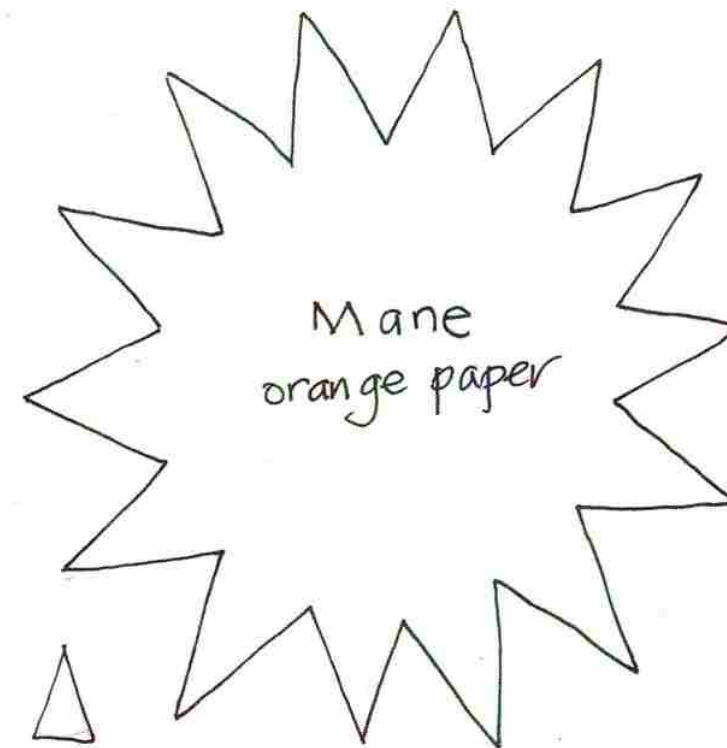
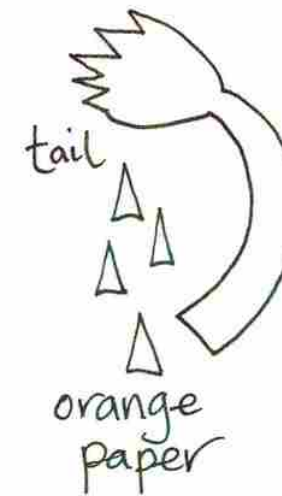
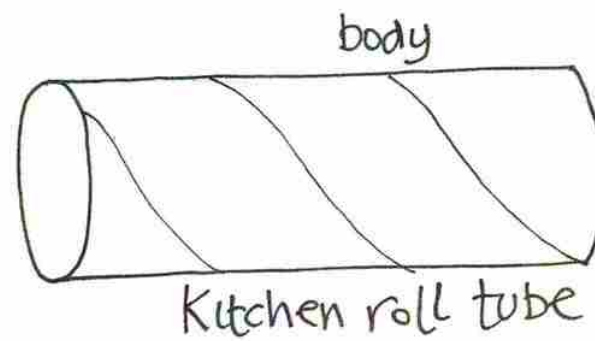
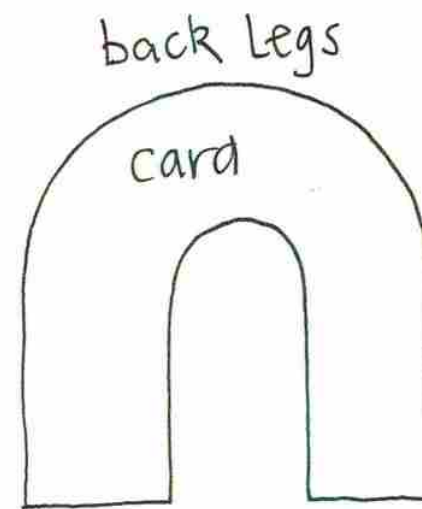
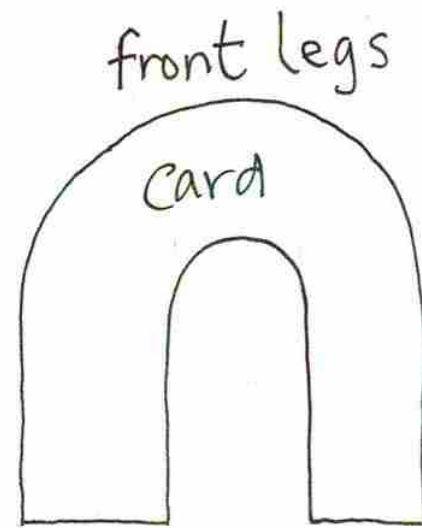




# a Lion



- 1 Cut two upside down 'U's from card and glue yellow paper to both sides
- 2 Cover a length of Kitchen roll tube in the same yellow paper
- 3 Glue them together as shown above.
- 4 Cut out the "mane" shape in orange paper.  
Glue it to the front legs as shown above
- 5 Cut out all of the face parts and stick them on the mane  
Add the two ears and the whiskers
- 6 The tail is the last piece. Glue it to the back legs as shown.

# a Snake

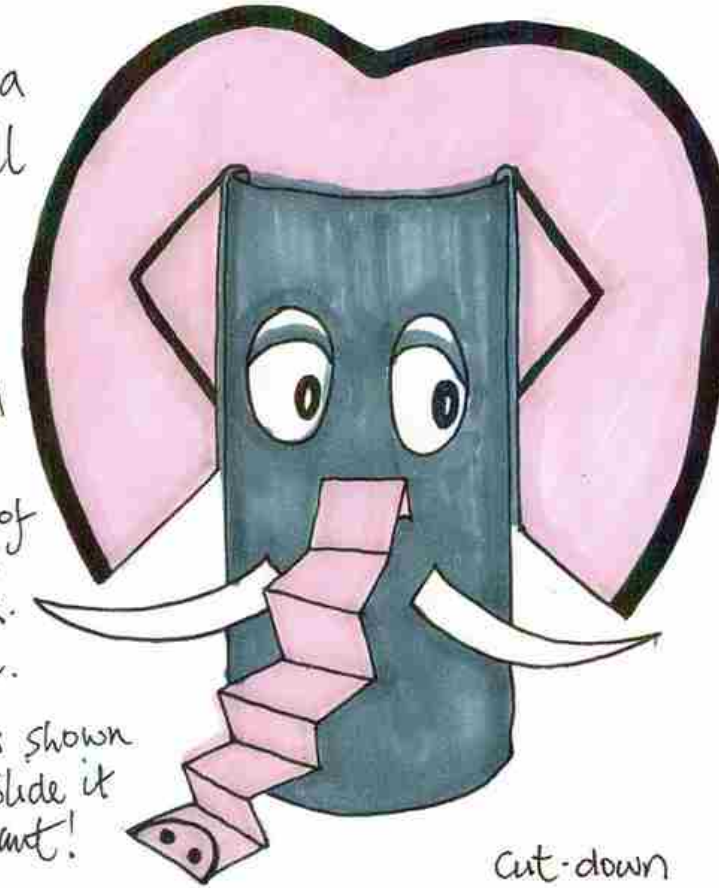


Cut the tube at an angle for the head to rest on



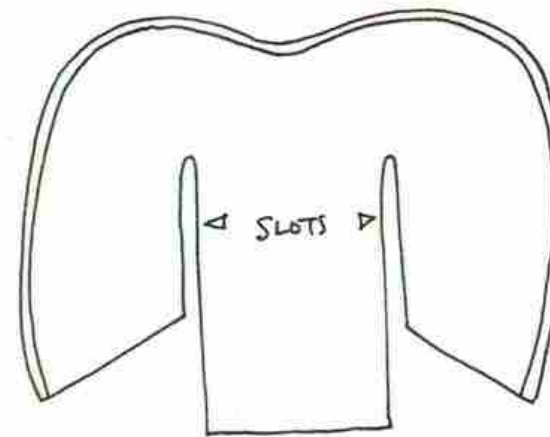
- ① wrap a kitchen roll tube in yellow paper.
- ② Cut strips of black paper and wrap them round the yellow tube, sticking them in place
- ③ Cut the top of the tube off at an angle.
- ④ Cut an upside down teardrop shape and glue it to the edge of the 'slope'. This forms the head.
- ⑤ Add the snake's eyes and its tongue.
- ⑥ Finally, glue the tube to the base, having decorated the tail as shown

# an Elephant



- ① Cut a section from a cardboard kitchen roll tube and cover it in grey paper.
- ② cut out two tusks and two eyes from white paper and stick them on as shown.
- ③ Concertina a thin piece of paper as shown at the bottom of this page. This is the trunk. fix it to the "face" with glue.
- ④ Cut out the elephant's ears as shown below and use the slots to slide it into place. That's your elephant!

# a Frog



- ① Cut out all of the components drawn above.
- ② Score the back of the body/feet and fold them forward.
- ③ Glue the card stand to the back of the body. Stand it up.
- ④ Glue the two legs in place. Curl the tongue with a pair of scissors.
- ⑤ Slide the tongue into the mouth slot and glue in place. Then glue the mouth in place.
- ⑥ Glue the eyes in place with the eyeballs attached.
- ⑦ Enjoy your frog toy!

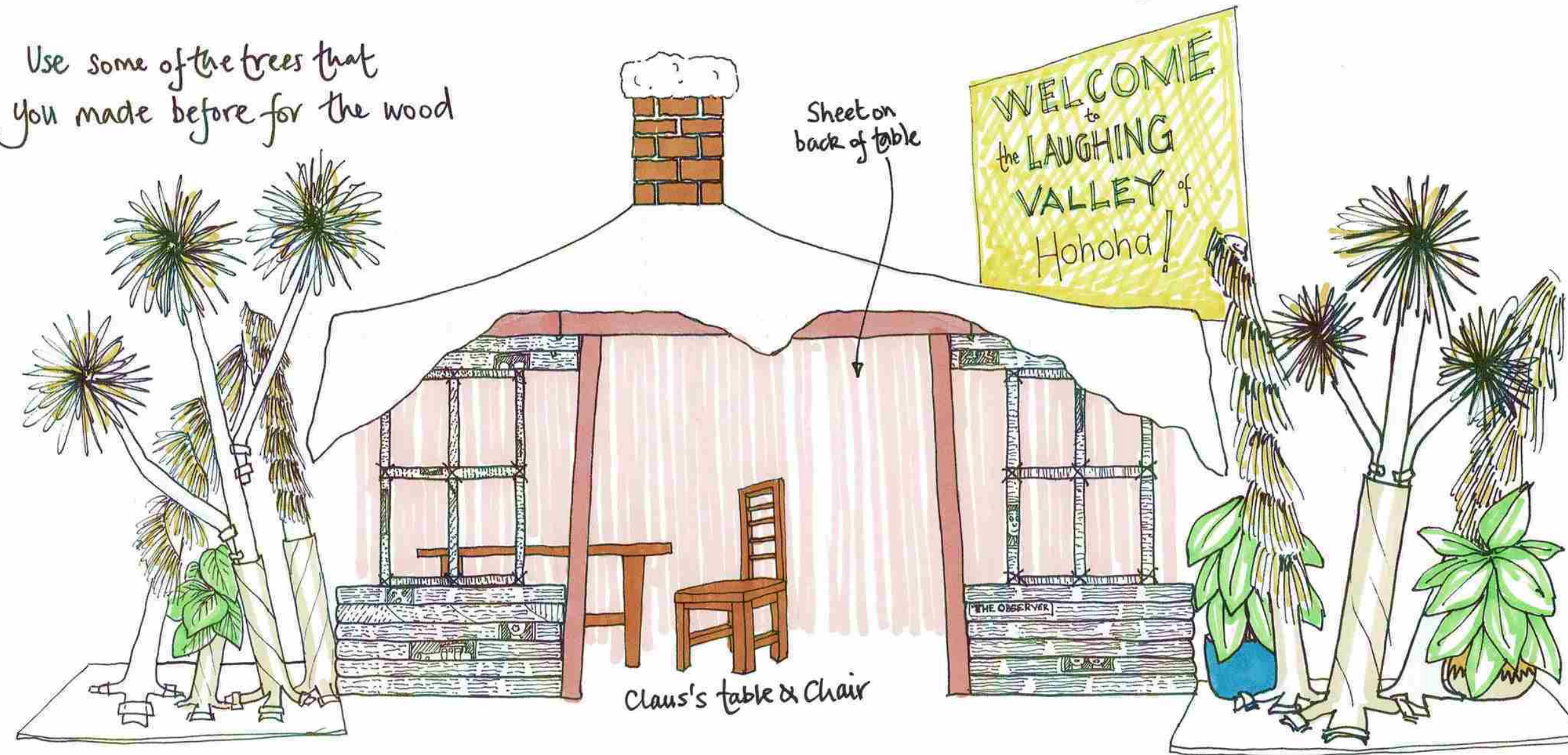
# The Laughing Valley and Claus's Cabin

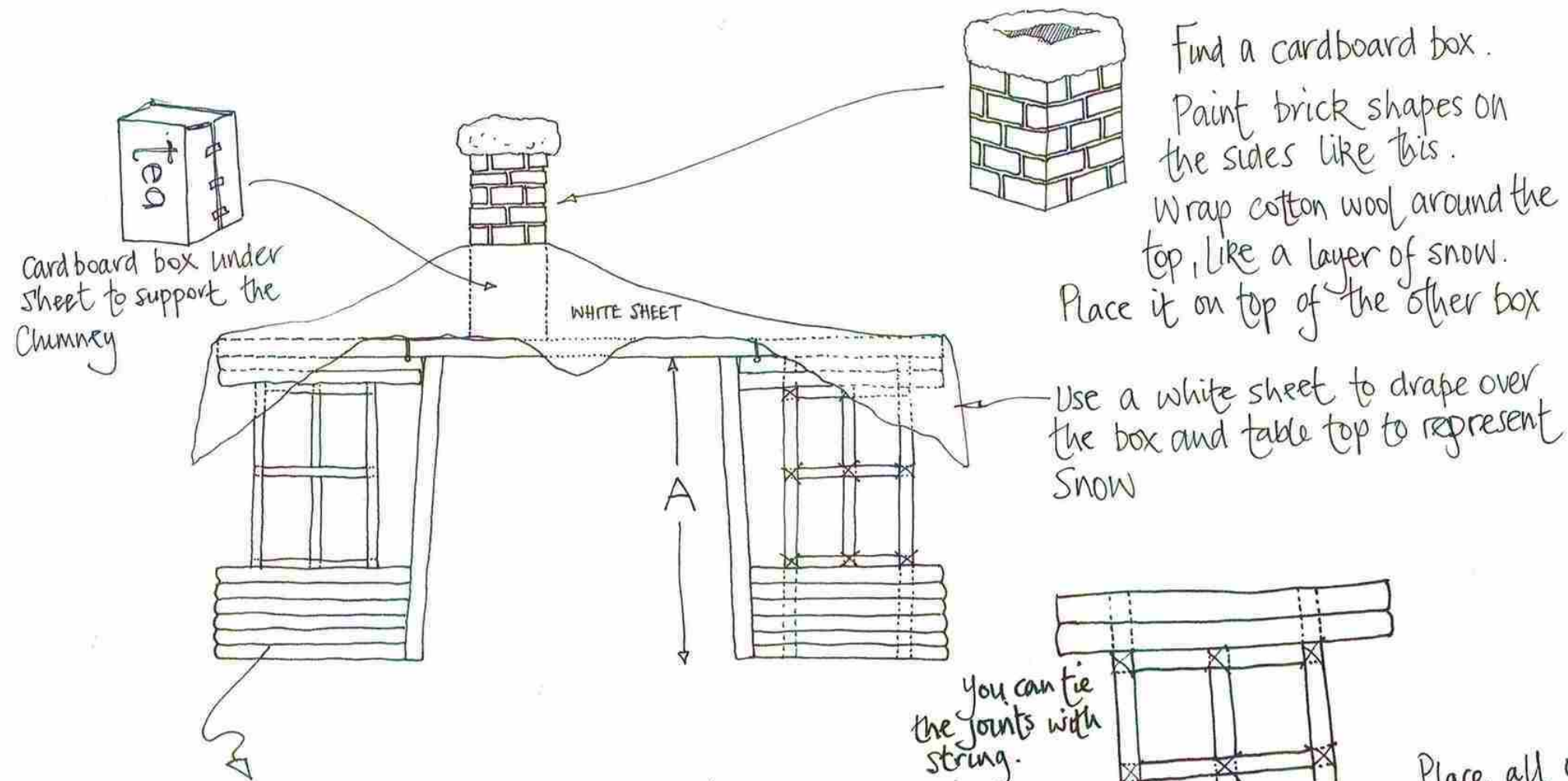


When Claus moves to the Laughing Valley, Knook and his friends make him a cabin out of felled trees! To make the Valley, you can use some of the trees you made for the Burzee Forest. Claus's Cabin could be made from the Kitchen table. Open the leaves (if your table has them) and then put a cardboard box on the top. Drape a white sheet over it, like snow, and let it hang over the edge in places. Paint bricks on another box and put it on top of the other box, making a chimney. The walls and windows are described on the next page!

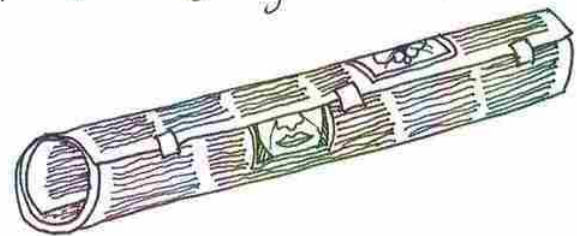




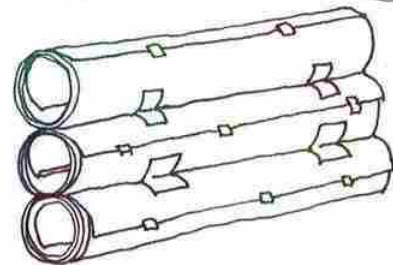
# Claus's Cabin



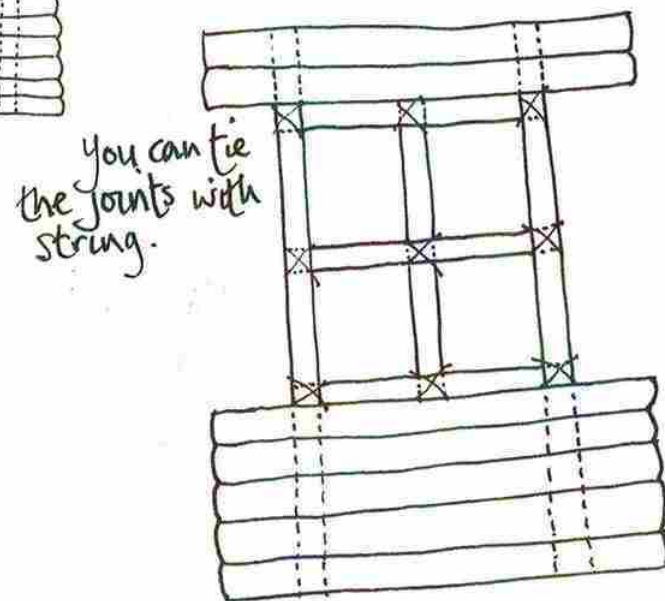
Take lots of newspaper pages!



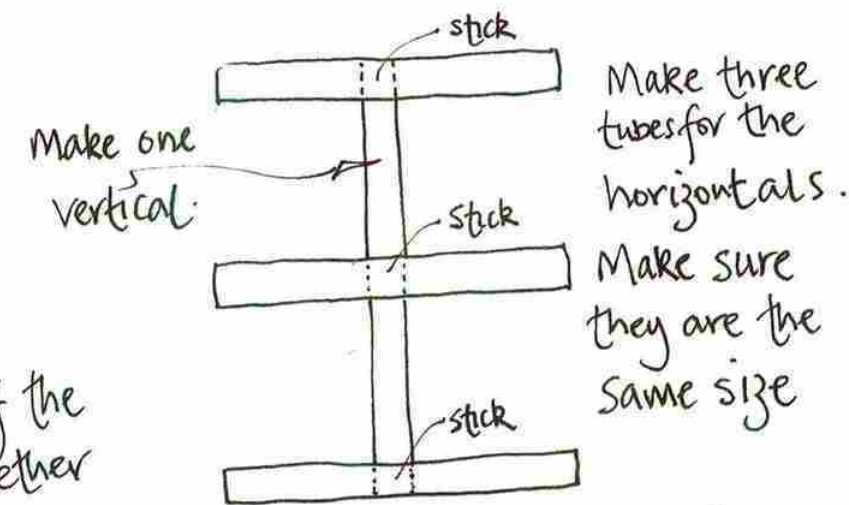
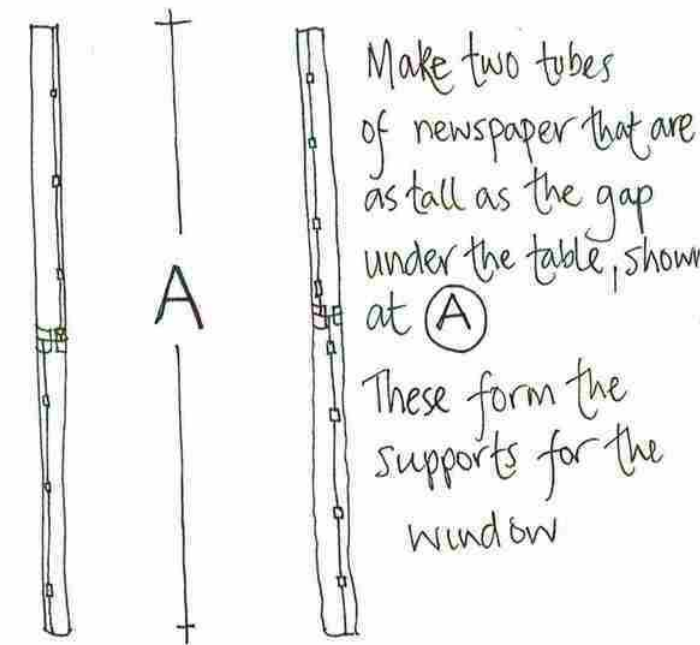
Roll each page up and secure the edges with sticky tape. Make lots!

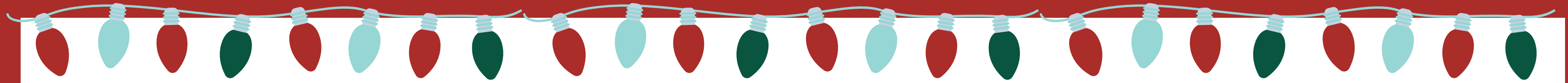
Using the guide, you could make toys like Santa Claus does in his workshop, make the setting for Santa's workshop and then perform this scene:

JACK: Your joy for these trinkets really melts my heart Claus... you know how dangerous that is.

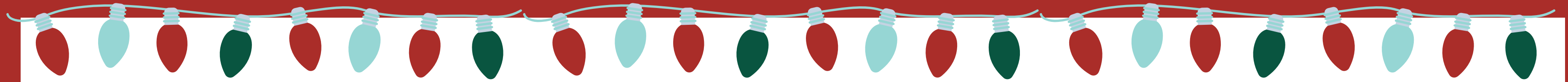
SANTA: Toys Jack, they're toys. Even you can't deny the smile that these toys put on children's faces is magical!

JACK: A polar bear then, the coolest of all the animals.

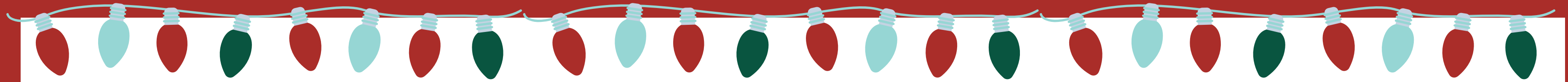
SANTA: Now you're talking Jack. I knew we'd make a good team.

JACK: Careful what you're saying Claus, I have a reputation to keep up.

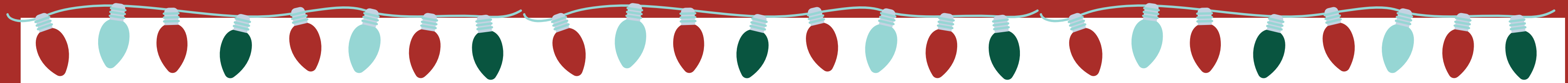
SANTA: Oh Jack, one day I'll have you as rosy-cheeked as the elves around here.

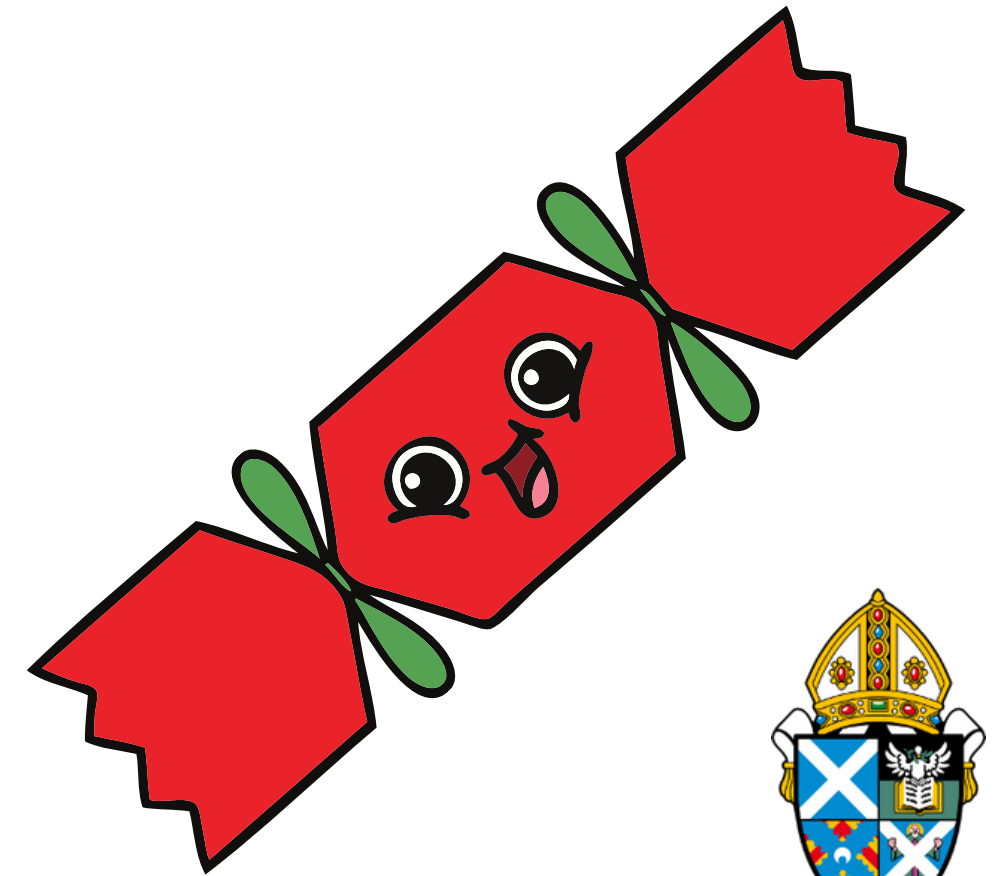

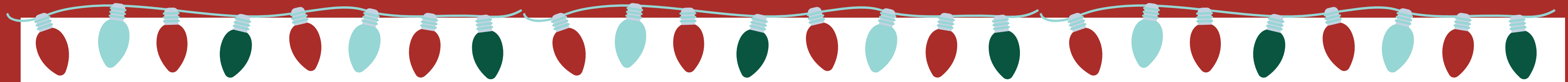

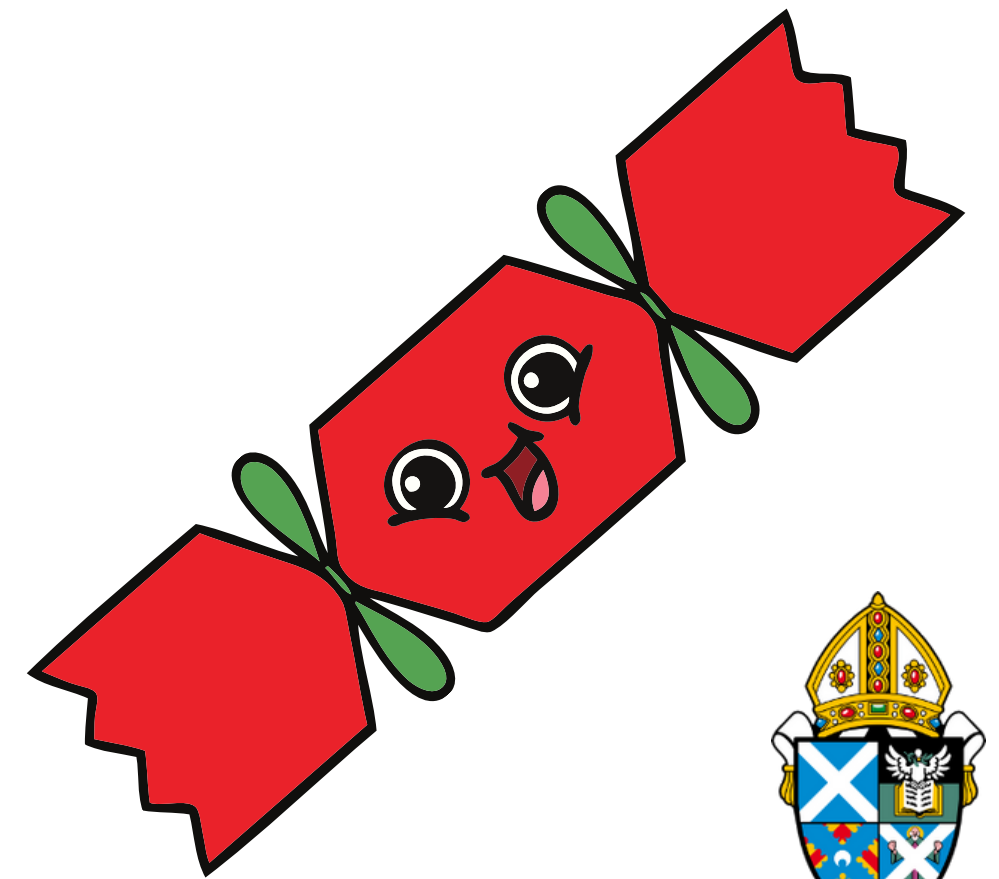
