






* Take a sheet of newspaper. How to Make a tree * Get the piggest one * If you want to make * Kitchen r Tube a taller tree, * Roll up the sheet and fix at the bottom of one end with sticky HH tape two, or more tubes together. -make 4 equal cuts tape Vse one Fold back flaps and tape them to a card base sheet for each branch / 8







How to Make a tree (continued) - 🕅 cut top when it's pulled up Make as many finished tree branches as you would like and sticky tape them together. CARDBOARDS TUDES 5 HH tape STICKY TAPE 10




The Beaver's Dam * use a small table - maybe a picnic table if you have one - with two small chairs leaning against it. Dicnic table * Chair Shopping bag of tims Use a Superman shopping bag filled with tins, or something like, to prop up the chair legs



Make your Backcloth from a sheet Make stars out of cardboard and cover with tin foil 众公公 Z 2mg Make a Moon face out of cave and paint it white. Draw details on with felt pens fix stors to sheet with safety pins blue sheet pegged to the back line 12
