Apprenticeship role purpose	The Apprentice Wardrobe Assistant will contribute to the effective and efficient delivery of Wardrobe Services, under supervision. The post holder works within the Production department and is expected to make a positive contribution to the development and success of the company. This apprenticeship is designed to build skills and confidence across the wardrobe function, supporting future careers in costume, dressing, and wardrobe maintenance. As an Apprentice Wardrobe Assistant, you will: Have the opportunity to work alongside experienced staff Gain job-specific skills Get time allocated for study, training and networking opportunities Be offered a up to £50 a week to support your travel costs to and from work Provide a stepping stone into the industry This apprenticeship is part of The Mackintosh Foundation's Regional Technical Apprenticeship Programme. This is the second cohort which The Foundation has supported and is being delivered in partnership with 15 venues across the country. As part of the programme all apprenticeships will receive additional support for their development and progress. This will take the form of monthly online catchups and				





development sessions, as well as opportunities for in person networking and learning. The Apprentice will be required to complete an End Point Assessment at the end of the training.

Apprenticeship structure:				
Year 1	Foundational Learning			
	Costume Construction – Basic sewing, cutting, hand finishing, use of machines and materials.			
	• Dressing and Maintenance – Introduction to quick changes, dressing etiquette, costume plots.			
	• Wig Handling and Hair — Fundamentals of wig preparation, setting, and maintenance.			
	• Costume Administration – Support with sourcing, hiring, returns, and wardrobe logistics.			
Year 2	Specialisation and application			
	The apprentice will take on increased responsibility, acting as a dresser and undertaking wardrobe maintenance tasks during performances, with more advanced making and upkeep work under supervision.			

Key Accountabilities:

- Assist with the manufacture and delivery of costumes and wigs to high production standards.
- Learn and assist with dressing duties during rehearsals and performances.
- Support wardrobe maintenance including repairs, laundry, pressing and continuity checks.
- Promote and support a positive health and safety culture in the wardrobe team.

Key Tasks:

- Assist in the making, finding, hiring or purchasing of costume items.
- Undertake supervised dressing responsibilities during performances and changeovers.
- Learn wig dressing and maintenance techniques under guidance.
- Participate in the cleaning, upkeep and documentation of all wardrobe items.
- Help maintain tidy and safe working areas including laundry and workrooms.
- Record costume notes and help update dressing plots and continuity reports.
- Participate in fittings and support alterations with team members.





• Support the wardrobe manager with costume logistics and administration tasks.

Health and Safety:

- Attend all required Health & Safety training, including COSHH and manual handling.
- Assist with documentation and risk assessments as directed.
- Contribute to the work of the Health and Safety committee as required.

Other:

- Assist with mentoring and shadowing opportunities for short-term placements.
- Contribute to environmental sustainability initiatives in the Wardrobe Department.
- Actively engage in continuous learning and personal development throughout the apprenticeship.
