How to Apply by Video or Voice Note

Thank you for your interest in becoming an Apprentice Wardrobe Assistant at Pitlochry Festival Theatre!

This is a full-time, paid apprenticeship running from 8 September 2025 to 10 September 2027. You'll learn on the job and receive structured online training from Chichester College Group. To be eligible, you must be aged 18 or over by the start date.

You can apply in writing using our form — or, if you'd rather talk through your answers, you're very welcome to send us a voice note or video recording instead. This guide will help you record everything you need to include. This recording replaces the need for a CV. Please read each question carefully and answer in your own words.

Please Start Your Recording and Answer These Questions:

Basic Information

- 1. Please say your full name.
- 2. Are you over 18 years old? Say "Yes" or "No".
- 3. What is your contact number?
- 4. What is your email address?
- 5. What town or area do you live in most of the time? (We ask this so we understand where you might be travelling from.)

About the Role

- 6. This role includes evening and weekend work. Are you happy with that? Say "Yes" or "No".
- 7. It also involves working at height sometimes like using a ladder or step stool. Are you comfortable with that?

Disability and Support Needs

8. Pitlochry Festival Theatre is a Disability Confident employer.

This question is entirely optional, and your answer will not affect your application. If you tick yes, we will offer you the opportunity to tell us about any adjustments you may need.

- 12. What do you love about theatre and costume making?

 Tip: You don't need professional experience just share what excites you, whether it's watching shows, making clothes, or learning new creative skills.

Your Skills and Learning

- 13. Tell us about any sewing, costume making, or craft experience you have.

 Tip: This could include school projects, hobbies, helping friends or family, or anything else where you've used your hands to make something.
- 14. What's something you've worked really hard to learn or get better at?

 Tip: This could be anything learning to draw, sew, swim, cook, do maths we want to know how you approach learning.
- 15. What's something you're proud of making or doing?

 Tip: We're interested in what's meaningful to you, whether it's a project, a performance, or helping someone.

16. Can you tell us about a time you worked with others to get something done? *Tip: Think about school group work, clubs, volunteering, or helping out at home.*

Working in the Arts

17. Do you have a qualification in Art, Design, or Sewing?
